Safe Arrivals - Reporting Student Absences 📞

There are **3 ways** to report your child's absence, late arrival or early departure:

1. Using the **Safe Arrival App** (download from Google or Apple Store)
2. Using the **SafeArrival website**, <https://go.schoolmessenger.ca/#/home> .
3. Calling the toll-free number **1.844.435.3440** to report an absence using the automated phone system.

The above 3 options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

NOTE: For absences greater than five consecutive days, please call your child's school directly.

Remember to: Please report absences in advance using SafeArrival instead of sending notes or calling/emailing the school.

Morning Attendance 🔔🔔

Thank you to our families for your support in establishing school routines. Your assistance in continuing to have children at school before 8:30am to begin their school day on time with their peers is appreciated and helps all children begin their day participating within the regular class routine.

Outdoor Clothing 🧣🧥

As cooler weather continues to unfold, we would ask that students come to school prepared for recesses and time spent outdoors. Layered clothing (which may include sweaters, jackets, hats and gloves) is recommended so that students can adjust to daily temperatures. Please ensure that all clothing is labelled with your child(ren)'s name(s) to help students to organize their belongings.



School Footwear 👟

Student safety is a priority at SFA. Students **are required** to wear running shoes during physical education classes, active outdoor play or participation in sports at recess. At no time should students be barefoot, in sock feet or wearing Crocs to participate in sports or physical games/activities at recess. Crocs may be worn as indoor shoes but students **must bring** an alternative to participate in physical education.

Lunch Drop Off 🍞

Please ensure that your child arrives at school with all the items they need for the day. We realize that there will be occasions where students forget something at home. There will be a table located outside the office in the vestibule for the convenience of parents/guardians who are dropping off items so that entry to the office is not necessary.

Please label the item clearly with the CHILD'S NAME AND TEACHER.

If you plan on bringing your child's lunch in the morning, let your children know that you will be leaving the lunch on the table in the vestibule.

Please note, that in accordance with our safety protocols, we do not allow unknown individuals to drop off lunches. This includes UberEats, Skip the Dishes, or any other delivery. Thank you for your support and cooperation in this matter.



DIGITAL REPORT CARD DELIVERY INFORMATION

As we approach the distribution of Progress Reports, please note that there will be an important change in how student Report Cards are shared. Beginning with the upcoming Progress Report on November 12th, SFA will be transitioning to an *electronic delivery system*. This means that your child's Report Cards will be sent directly to **your child's registered DPCDSB student email account**. This new process aims to provide families with quicker and more convenient access to your child's academic updates.

Families will receive a follow-up email from the school which will include instructions on how to access the report cards ONCE they have been sent digitally.

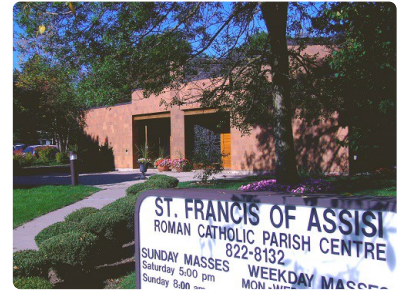

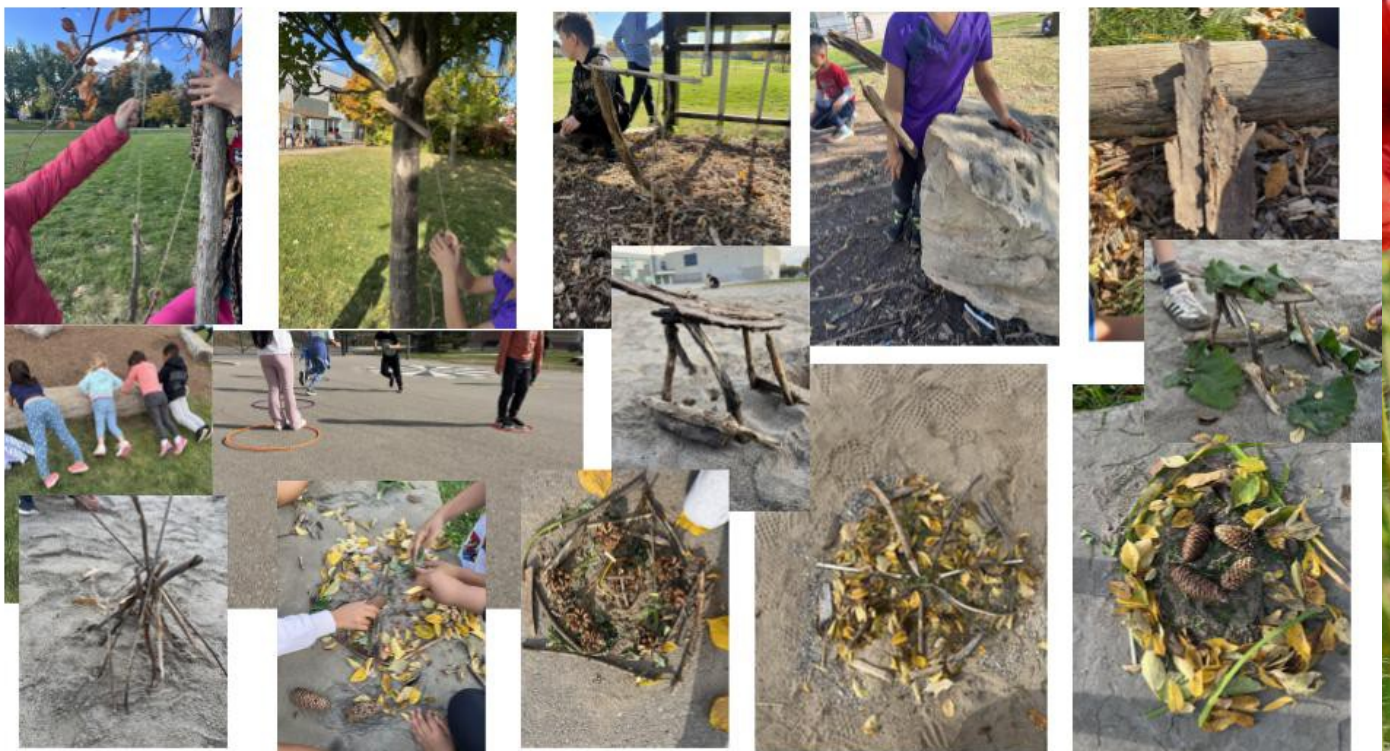

DPCDSB's 2025-2026 French Immersion Program Virtual Information Sessions

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) will hold two virtual public information meetings for parents and guardians interested in enrolling their child(ren) in the board's Grade 1 *French Immersion Program* for the 2025-2026 school year.

The information sessions will provide parents and guardians with the following:

- an overview of the *French Immersion Program*,
- criteria for admission,
- information about the online application process,
- information about the random selection process (should the number of applications exceed the number of spaces available).

DPCDSB currently offers the Grade 1 French Immersion Program at eight school sites. Students registered in this Grade 1 program will spend 90% of their year learning in the French language. All subjects and activities in the French Immersion classroom, except for Religion and Family Life, will be delivered in French. In Grades 2 and 3, 70% of the instruction will be in French, with the proportion of English increasing to 50% in later years. This means that after at least 3,800 hours of French instruction by the end of Grade 8, students will be able to participate adequately in French conversations and develop intercultural awareness of French-speaking communities.

Virtual information sessions for parents/guardians will be held on two different evenings based on region of interest. We ask that parents/guardians attend *only one* of the following online sessions:

Routine Vaccines for Students in Grades 7 - November 12th

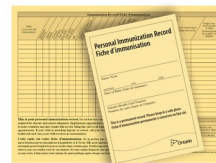
Routine Vaccines for Students in Grades 7-12 - It Takes a Village

Every year, Peel Public Health teams up with schools and parents to make sure students get their important vaccines. As part of the Ontario immunization routine schedule, Grade 7 students aged 11 or older are eligible for their routine vaccines. Students can get Hepatitis B (HB), Human Papillomavirus (HPV-9), and Meningitis (Men-C-ACYW) vaccines. These vaccines are safe, have been used for a long time and help keep everyone healthy!

Vaccinations: A Shared Responsibility

Starting in the fall, vaccination clinics will be set up in schools to help students stay on track and get these vaccines for free. The goal is to make sure all students get their vaccines before they complete Grade 8.

For Parents: Keeping Your Child Healthy



If your child is in Grade 7 or 8, check with their school to see when vaccine clinics are happening. You will also get an immunization **fact sheet and a paper consent form to sign**. For parents of high school students, it's not too late! If your child missed these vaccines in elementary school, they could receive them for free. You can book an appointment at one of [Peel's community immunization clinics](#). Remember, students 16 years or older must give their own consent for vaccines.

Tips for Managing Screentime

Did you know?

Too much screen time increases your child's risk of becoming:

- Sleep-deprived
- Less school-ready
- Inattentive
- Aggressive
- Nearsighted (when objects farther away look blurry)



Tips for Managing Screentime:

- Encourage and participate in face-to-face interactions such as shared reading, outdoor play, board games, and crafts
- Turn off screens when not in use and avoid background TV use
- Model screen time use around children and minimize your own use during mealtimes and play

Reminder: All children 19 years of age or younger are eligible for an OHIP-covered eye exam by an optometrist each year.

Dental Screening At School

Peel Public Health provides free dental screening for kids in Peel elementary schools. What is a dental screening?

- A dental screening is a quick look in the child's mouth by a registered dental hygienist using a no-touch technique.
- dental hygienist using a no-touch technique.
- A separate, sterilized mouth mirror is used for each child.
- A dental screening identifies children who may need dental care.



What happens after a school dental screening?

- A form with the results of the dental screening will go home with every child screened.
- If a child is identified with a dental condition requiring immediate dental treatment, an additional form will be attached for parents to fill in and return to Peel Public Health. Please read the form(s) carefully.
